The career intern program provides systematic, formal training and development in a two-year internship. Upon successful completion of the internship, the intern may be placed in a permanent career position (time spent in the internship is included in total career service). The internship is full-time/permanent with benefits.

Internship is with the U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) located in **Wilmington, DE**. The mission of OSHA is to develop and promulgate occupational safety and health standards, develop and issue regulations; conduct investigations and inspections to determine the status of compliance with safety and health standards and regulations; issue citations and proposes penalties for non-compliance with safety and health standards and regulations; assist and encourage the States in developing occupational safety and health state plans that are "as effective as" the Federal programs; and provides training and education in the field of occupational safety and health.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF POSITIONS:

Receives assignments in general and specific health and safety matters, and performs duties related to the identification and evaluation of conditions in the workplace which may adversely affect the health of employees in a variety of workplaces. Performs portions of industrial hygiene inspections which are being conducted by a higher grade industrial hygienist. Trainee level inspections are performed in accordance with agency policy and organizational goals.

Reviews company's required recordkeeping, interviews employees, takes photographs, and collects environmental samples using a variety of sampling equipment. Presents data and makes recommendations to higher grade industrial hygienist on actions to be taken.

Assists in planning, preparing, organizing and documenting enforcement cases and interventions in accordance with agency policy and organizational goals. Performs field calibration of equipment.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIREMENTS

GS-9: This is a positive education position. Master's or equivalent graduate degree; OR 2 full years of progressively higher level graduate education leading to such a degree; OR LL.B. or J.D., if related, with major study in industrial hygiene, engineering, physical science, or life science which includes 12 semester hours in CHEMISTRY, including ORGANIC CHEMISTRY, PLUS 18 additional semester hours in any combination of chemistry, physics, engineering, health physics, environmental health, biostatistics, biology, physiology, toxicology, epidemiology, or industrial hygiene.

OR

Have a combination of education and specialized experience--at least 12 semester hours of course work in chemistry, including organic chemistry, and 18 additional semester hours as specified in above, plus appropriate experience or additional education.

Specialized experience is experience of industrial hygiene concepts, principles, and practices applicable to the performance of portions of industrial hygiene inspections of a variety of private industrial concerns. Also requires knowledge of sampling equipment and techniques. Skill in calibrating and using a wide variety of industrial hygiene sampling instrumentation.

FOREIGN EDUCATION: To receive credit for education outside the U.S., you must show proof that the education has been submitted to a private organization that specializes in interpretation of foreign credentials and that such education has been deemed to be at least equivalent to that gained in conventional U.S. educational programs.
